

There is a National Monument near Santa Fe called Tent Rocks. The only access is through the Cochiti Pueblo, so to visit you get a pass online from [Recreation.gov](https://www.recreation.gov) and a permit online from the Pueblo. Don't even show up without all the proper QR codes.

Everyone with the right credentials, and it's a mob, is then allowed into the park, driving from the reservation in a long caravan behind a pilot truck. Once at the park the mob foams out of their vehicles and elbows their way onto the two trails.



The two trails are: "Slot Canyon" and "Cave Loop".
We took Cave Loop first. Less mobbed.







I suppose technically this is a cave, but “hole in a tent rock” would be more descriptive.

We didn't care – the air was cool, the sun was warm, and the scenery was excellent.





When we got back to the parking lot, we picked up the Slot Canyon trail.
